





There are 3 modes on this keyboard that you can enjoy: Sound, Rhythm and Song


SOUND mode This is the default mode on booting up. The display shows the current selected Sound number, and + & - buttons change the Sound to the next or previous ones.

RHYTHM mode The display shows the current selected Rhythm number, and + & - buttons change the Rhythm contents. Press Sound to go back to selecting Sound.

#### SONG mode

The display shows the current selected Song number, and + & - buttons change the Song selection. Press Sound to go back to selecting Sound.

(Press and hold)

#### Press and hold C1, C#1 and D1 keys at the same time to engage Function parameter access. Release the keys to disengage Function.
